Specialist PE coaches have been employed throughout the year for both KS1 and KS2, providing sports which otherwise would not be possible.</p>	<p>£1007.50</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>To provide all children with access to specialist knowledge and skills in order to improve their sporting ability, knowledge and understanding.</li> <li>To provide all children with access to a wider variety of games and activities using equipment that they may not otherwise have had access to.</li> <li>To provide the KS1 and KS2 PE teacher with a CPD opportunity in gathering specialist knowledge and teaching skills.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Children have progressed well with their PE skills as shown on our assessment charts for each child. Their knowledge and understanding of sporting vocabulary and tactics within games has greatly improved. In particular, their knowledge and understanding of a wider range of different sports has improved. Such as, tri-golf, fencing and tag rugby. Some children have shown a keen interest in these sports and have discussed the possibility of taking them up outside of school.</li> <li>Over not only this academic year, but across the past few whilst funding has been available, the children have had access to a wider range of games and activities which we could not have provided ourselves. Some of these, as mentioned above, have this year included fencing and tri-golf. The children have been very engaged in these new activities and it has given some of them a more positive view of sports and exercise.</li> <li>Teachers are now more confident in delivering a wider range of PE lessons covering games, athletics, gymnastics and dance. The children have benefitted from having two members of staff being able to teach them simultaneously at numerous points throughout the year.</li> </ul>

Carlisle Utd coaches have been paid to come into school and deliver a variety of sessions with KS1 and KS2 pupils throughout the year.</p>			<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>To provide all children with access to specialist knowledge and skills in order to improve their sporting ability, knowledge and understanding.</li> </ul>
<p>3. All EYFS, KS1 and KS2 children have had swimming lessons for the full summer term.</p>	<p>£805 – Pool hire</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>To provide children with more swimming lessons in order to increase swimming ability.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>By the end of the summer term 92% of our KS2 class (years 3, 4, 5, 6) could swim the National Curriculum Standard of 25m. 100% of year 6 children met their expectation and could swim 25m unaided and achieved NC level 4.</li> <li>At the start of the summer term 78% of KS1 children were swimming with aids and by the end of the term only 30% of KS1 were swimming with aids.</li> <li>22% of KS1 could swim 25m, exceeding the expectations for their age group.</li> <li>85% of the whole school received a certificate for survival training. This ranged from basic survival to more difficult levels.</li> </ul>

Purchasing of new outdoor gym/fitness equipment.</p>	<p>£4850 £361.05 – repair of other equipment</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• To provide children with more opportunities to become increasingly active.</li> <li>• To provide children an increasing awareness of health and fitness.</li> <li>• To provide the wider community with access to fitness equipment.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• This new equipment was purchased and ready to use in March 2017 with the help of a lottery grant. The children have shown huge interest in the new equipment and are using it daily. Many of the children are improving with the targets they set themselves, even at this early stage. There is specialist equipment for our KS1 class and our KS2 class, which aids differentiation and challenge for all. The equipment is therefore accessible for all of our children.</li> <li>• Children appear to be more active during playtimes and are becoming more aware of different activities they can try.</li> <li>• Our equipment is open to the wider community which they have made use of already.</li> </ul>
<p>5. Transport to allow years 4, 5 and 6 children to take part in an outdoor and adventurous residential trip.</p> <p>6. Hire of outdoor climbing wall for use at residential.</p>	<p>£250 (Transport) £400</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• To provide children with an experience of outdoor adventurous activities which could not be provided in school.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Being able to use the funding to get us to the outdoor centre opened up an excellent opportunity for the children.</li> <li>• It helped to develop children’s confidence in learning and experiencing new activities. Their ability to work well as a team has also improved. The use of specially trained outdoor instructors provided the children with high quality expertise and teaching, resulting in successful experiences for all children.</li> </ul>

Improvements have been made in children’s progress and achievement in these sports. Sports/activities have included: dance, cricket and multi-skills.</li> </ul>
